CHAINS

The following field notes describe the remonumentation of certain original corners, Township 24 North, Range 77 West, Sixth Principal Meridian, Wyoming, as provided for in the Special Instructions for Group No. 540, Wyoming, dated June 11, 1990. "Providing for the investigation and evaluation of physical corner evidence, and the remonumentation of certain identified corners with new accessories when needed, in the State of Wyoming."

The subdivisional lines of the township were surveyed by William O. Owen in 1881.

William O. Owen reported in his notes and indicated on the plat of the township that numerous corners were monumented with petrified mastodon bone. In his autobiography there is an account concerning this township and the reason for the unusual monumentation. A decision was made by BLM Wyoming State Office Cadastral Survey and paleontologists from the Wyoming State Office and the University of Wyoming Geology Museum to visit the area with the intent of recovering some of the unusual monumentation and to identify the federal interest in section 4, T. 24 N., R. 77 W., Sixth Principal Meridian, Wyoming.

The identified corners were recovered using a Garmin Model 12 XL handheld GPS unit and GCDB coordinates.

executed by William O. Owen in 1881)

The 1/4 cor. of secs. 3 and 4, monumented with a fossilized portion of vertebra bone, 11x8x6 ins., believed to be from of a sauropod, plainly mkd. 1/4 on a face, embedded on its side, projecting 2 ins. above the ground with the 1/4 face up. Record: notes called for a petrified bone of a mastodon, 14x10x7 ins.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 2½ ins. diam., 28 ins. long, set 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Record: notes called for a petrified bone of a mastodon, 12x10x8 ins.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., 28 ins. long, set 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T24N R77W S 3 1/4 ——— S 10 2001</p> <p>Placed the original cor. stone on the ground alongside the iron post.</p> <hr style="width: 80%; margin: 10px auto;"/> <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area where these corners were remonumented is located on the northern portion of the boundary between Albany and Carbon Counties, approximately 10 miles north east of Medicine Bow, Wyoming. The terrain is flat prairie that descends gradually to the Little Medicine Bow River and Sheep Creek west of the corners.</p> <p>There are no ranches or houses in the immediate vicinity. No improvements have been made in the area including evidence of fences. There are very few stones evident for suitable monumentation which accounts for the unusual monuments William Owen used.</p> <p>Access is provided by Marshall Road and private trail roads.</p>


