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

A history of surveys is contained in the field notes.

A portion of the First Standard Parallel North (south boundary) was dependently resurveyed by Lynn A. Forbes during the dependent resurvey of T. 4 N., R. 4 W., executed concurrently under this same group.

This plat represents the dependent resurvey of a portion of the subdivisonal lines, designed to restore the corners in their true original locations according to the best available evidence, T. 5 N., R. 4 W., Wind River Meridian, Wyoming.

Except as indicated hereon, the lotting and areas are as shown on the plat approved January 14, 1899.
