

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- A.) Cor. of Secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, T. 52 N., R. 93 W., 6th Principal Meridian Wyoming.
- B.) HISTORY OF SURVEYS: E. A. LaPeire surveyed the subdivisional lines in 1883; subsequently cancelled. Edward F. Stahle surveyed the private land claims and subdivisional lines in 1904. Deposited a mkd. stone 12 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35; dig pits 18x18x12 ins. in each sec., 4 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high over deposit. In SE. pit drive a pine stake 24 ins. long, 2 ins. sq., 12 ins. in the ground, mkd. T52N S26, on NE., R93W S35 on SE., S34 on SW., and S27 in NW. faces, with 1 notch on S. and 2 notches on E. edges.
- C.) DESCRIPTION OF EVIDENCE FOUND, INCLUDING ACCESSORIES: Monumented with a granite stone, 4x3x2 ins. plainly mkd. X on a face, and buried 12 ins. below the surface of the ground, with a 2x2 in. square wood stake, projecting 7 ins. above ground alongside.
- D.) DESCRIPTION OF REMONUMENTED CORNER, INCLUDE NEW ACCESSORIES, DISPOSITION OF EVIDENCE AND A LOCATION STATEMENT:

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., set 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the original cor. stone and set a steel fence post alongside the iron post.
